SkillsUSA Championships

Hands-on Leadership and Skills on Display

The National Leadership & Skills Conference (NLSC) is the nation's largest workforce development event for students enrolled in public career and technical education programs. SkillsUSA hosts the annual SkillsUSA Championships during NLSC at an estimated cost of more than \$36 million. It is considered the largest skill competition in the world and the single largest day of industry volunteerism in America. SkillsUSA represents 130 different occupational areas and adds contests to the SkillsUSA Championships each year to meet the demands of new or expanding careers. Begun in 1967, the SkillsUSA Championships features over 6,600 competitors in 115 hands-on skill and leadership contests. Each contestant is a state gold medalist.

Dates and Locations

The SkillsUSA Championships will be held on Wednesday, June 26 and Thursday, June 27 at the Georgia World Congress Center (GWCC). Competition orientations are held on Tuesday, June 25. The best photo opportunities will be on Thursday, from 10 a.m. to noon or 1 p.m. to 2 p.m.

The SkillsUSA Championships requires 2,000 computers, 12,500 bricks and 1,500 blocks, 60+ stoves and ovens, 25+ refrigerators, 100+ welders, 50+ manufacturing machines and complete laboratories for machining, welding, auto repair and painting. <u>Brief contest descriptions</u> are on our website.

Skill Point Certificates

SkillsUSA awards Skill Point Certificates to outstanding national contestants in addition to the gold, silver or bronze medals. The industry leaders who define the competencies for each contest determine a "cut score" that indicates excellence in a technical or leadership event. Contestants who meet or exceed this scoring threshold will earn a Skill Point certificate that represents proficiency and workplace readiness in the career area.

Keynote Speaker Cory James

Cory James is an award-winning journalist who co-anchors the Washington, D.C. News Now program on weekday mornings. A SkillsUSA member at Salem High School and Rockdale Career Academy in Conyers, Ga., James competed in the SkillsUSA



Georgia state championships as part of the Broadcast News Production team (now called Video News Production), placing second in his junior year and first in his senior year, with their team ranking fourth at the SkillsUSA Championships.

Poet Amena Brown

Amena Brown will kick off our Opening Session with a poem written especially for SkillsUSA. She is a writer, spoken word poet and performing artist whose work interweaves storytelling, rhyme and humor. The author of five spoken word albums and two non-fiction books, Brown's poetry was featured in the New York Times bestseller, "Rhythm of Prayer: A Collection of Meditations for Renewal." Brown is the co-executive producer and co-host of the Wake Up and Create podcast, in partnership with WABE/NPR and CreativeMornings Atlanta.

Special Guest Chris Gardner, the CEO of HappYness

Chris Gardner is an entrepreneur, international best-selling author and an award-winning film producer. Gardner's autobiography, "The Pursuit of HappYness" became a New York Times #1 best seller and has been translated into over 40 languages, including six dialects of Chinese and recently into Arabic. "The Pursuit of HappYness" was the inspiration for the critically acclaimed film in which Will Smith received the Golden Globe, Screen Actors Guild and Academy Award nominations for his performance. His second book, "Start Where You Are" was also a best seller, published in 2009. Gardner's new book "Permission to Dream" was selected as "Book of The Month" by the Wall Street Journal upon its publication.

Opening Session Highlights

After close to 40 years of working on Wall Street, Gardner answered an important question for himself which was, "What am I going to do with the rest of my life? Do I retire or REWIRE?" He chose to "REWIRE." The difference being, "When I retire I stop doing what I used to do. When I REWIRE, I do what I want to do!" Gardner is currently, in his words, "making a huge alternative investment" in human capital. He is conducting his Permission 2 Dream Tour and has spoken at over 500 schools on three different continents. He believes that "what CAN be, needs to be as much a part of the conversation as what can NOT be." Gardner also believes that "DREAMS don't have BORDERS." The student participants will work in teams to apply their skills and construct children's bicycles that will be presented to local children. The day of service will begin with a kickoff rally for attendees and business partners at 9 a.m. in the Georgia World Congress Center. From 9:30 a.m. until 12 noon, students will work in teams to apply their skills and carefully construct the bicycles.

For more than 20 years, community service events have been hosted during the SkillsUSA national conference to provide the students with a hands-on service opportunity. The community service projects vary from year to year, but the purpose is to engage SkillsUSA members from across the nation in learning to work together for a common purpose and serving others and strengthening their own personal leadership skills.

Overview: SkillsUSA is the #1 workforce development organization for students. We empower students to become skilled professionals, career-ready leaders and responsible community members. SkillsUSA is a nonprofit that serves high school, college and middle school students who are preparing for careers or further education in trade, technical and skilled service occupations, including health occupations. A partnership of students, teachers and industry working together to ensure America has a skilled workforce, SkillsUSA helps each student excel.

Membership: SkillsUSA serves more than 400,000 students and instructors in middle schools, high schools and college/postsecondary institutions in every state and three U.S. territories. SkillsUSA has served more than 15 million annual members since its founding in 1965. SkillsUSA programming covers 130 trade, technical and skilled service occupations, and the organization is recognized by the U.S. departments of Education and Labor as integral to career and technical education and a successful model of employer-driven youth development training.

Mission: SkillsUSA is America's proud champion of the skilled trades with a mission to empower students to become skilled professionals, career-ready leaders and responsible community members. The organization improves the quality of our nation's future skilled workforce through the development of SkillsUSA Framework skills that include Personal, Workplace and Technical Skills grounded in academics. Vision: SkillsUSA produces the most highly skilled workforce in the world, providing every member the opportunity for career success.

These national technical competitions help establish industry standards for job skill training and entry-level workers.
