SkillsUSA Bellringers

Use these bellringers - or startup tasks - to engage students, with topics that tie directly to SkillsUSA. The bellringers are written as questions or directions that instructors can post for students to answer when they first enter the classroom. Write these on a board, display on the projector, or hand them out on sheets for students to answer.



- Imagine you are talking to a friend and they ask you, "What is SkillsUSA?" Respond to their question in at least three sentences and include at least five facts about the organization.
- 2 Create a story or post promoting the next SkillsUSA event that the chapter is holding.
- Which SkillsUSA competition will you explore next and why?
- Picture this: You just won a National SkillsUSA Championship. You were awarded \$1,000 and you must use it in a way that benefits you local chapter. Describe how you would use your prize money.
- 5 Create an acrostic poem using each letter of your first name to describe some aspect of SkillsUSA.
- Your chapter officer team asked you to create a new SkillsUSA event that they chapter can implement this year. Create a plan for the event or activity to pitch to the officer team. Include its name, a description, when it would be held, which Essential Element it would teach and the Program of Work category it fits into.
- Think of a career path you might want to go into in the future. How can SkillsUSA help you achieve a career in that pathway?
- SkillsUSA happens in the classroom, the chapter, and the workplace. Brainstorm three lists of SkillsUSA activities that might occur in each of these three areas.
